December is quickly approaching, and it is once again, time to begin planning this year's wreath sale. This is the Troop's one and only fund raising project, and provides the Troop with the largest part of its operating funds

It, pays for each Scout's registration and insurance, and provides an opportunity for each Scout to build up points in their Scout Accounts to use towards the expense of scouting activities and equipment.

For those new to the troop, this fund raiser is about as painless as they get. The wreaths really sell themselves. They are an excellent buy, attractive, and hardy. Once you get a customer, repeat sales are a snap.

THE BASIC BOX

TROOP 152 WREATH SALE

Each scout will be asked to sell 12 wreaths. Profits from the sale are split between the Troop's general fund and your Scout's Account. The Troop Committee will be deciding the details on price and the percentage split offered at their October meeting.

Scouts and Scouters who do not sell the quota will be asked to contribute to their cost of insurance and registration with the Troop's charter.

For our existing Scouts, remember to canvass last year's customers and get a count to submit as an advance order. This will help insure delivery to those customers counting on your wreath this year.

Don't forget to set aside the mornings of Fri & Sat 11/23 & 24 to help unload the delivery truck and pick up your wreaths for delivery.

This fund raiser is a lot of fun, but also a very serious financial undertaking. Some 1200 wreaths will pass through the hands Of the Troop, and provide the funds that make our Scouting program so successful. We appreciate everyone's participation. Watch for more details coming from the Committee this month.
