BASICS BOX **TRIP PLANNING**

Troop 152 camps each month throughout the vear, except in December. Getting ready for a trip is always easier with a little planning.

TROOP PLANS - Organizing a trip for the troop is challenging but rewarding. Don't be afraid to volunteer to take us somewhere or help one of the organizers. It is important to let the troop know that you plan to attend, at least two (2) weeks before the trip. Getting the permission slip in by this due date helps the organizer submit the tour permit with Council, schedule transportation, assign tent partners, and distribute cash to the patrols to buy food.

If you wait until the last Tuesday, planning becomes difficult.

PERSONAL PLANS - The information that you and your scout need to prepare for the trip are provided on the permission slip, and at the meetings marked on the newsletter schedule as "required" for trip attendance. This is typically the Tuesday prior to the trip. Some points to watch for:

. Cooking - By troop, patrol, or tent partner. You may have to bring your own food or buy for the patrol.

Special activities - Pack what you need for the weather expected and activities published, swimming, hiking, skiing, etc

Spending money for road stops or special activities.

Medications are usually held by the scoutmaster or designee. Make sure meds are in their original bottles with dosage instructions.

So, do a little planning. Do it early. Let us know that you are going ASAP. Pack for the trip and have a GREAT time!
