## CONORAVIRUS DISRUPTION

Troop activities are still being impacted by the Covid-19 opening policies. We have cancelled all troop camping activities through September 2020. The troop is continuing with the outdoor in person troop meetings on Tuesdays from 7:00 to 8:30 PM. We meet at the Upper Gwynedd Twp Pavilion. The meetings concentrate on advancement and of course a game or two. The “in person” guidelines require each scout and adult attending the meeting to have a temperature check, and to hand in a Covid-19 Screening Questionnaire. Of course, masks or face coverings shall be required to be worn and social distancing of 6 feet between attendees is required. # THE BASICS BOX - SCOUT SPIRIT

## DUTY to God, and Country DUTY to Others and Self

A Scout is :

**Trustworthy, Loyal, Helpful, Friendly, Courteous, Kind, Obedient, Cheerful, Thrifty, Brave, Clean, and Reverent**

**On my honor, I will do my best, to do my duty, to God and my Country, to obey the Scout Law, to help other people at all times, to keep myself physically strong, mentally awake, and morally straight.**

All scouts achieving the rank of 2<sup>nd</sup> Class, 1<sup>st</sup> Class, Star, Life, Eagle, and Eagle Palms must demonstrate "Scout Spirit".

The Leaders of Troop 152 review all scouts advancing to the ranks above 1<sup>st</sup> Class. In order to know that a scout demonstrates "Scout Spirit", the leaders must know the scout.

The troop requires that your scout attend 50% of all troop meetings and 50% of Troop activities for the past three months when advancement is being reviewed.

As our scouts get older, many other interests pressure their time. Scouting does require a commitment to participate, to enjoy the activities and to contribute to the Troop by helping other scouts, and participating in service projects.

Demonstrating "Scout Spirit" is an important part of being a Scout, and necessary to advance through the ranks of Scouting. By living the Scout Oath and Law in everyday life, a Scout has a profound influence on all around him, and perpetuates the ideals of the Scouting movement. Participate with your Troop. Show us your spirit!
