Opening in 1941 without a speed limit, the PA Turnpike was the country's first superhighway. It's been lengthened, widened, and in some spots, bypassed and abandoned. We'll be visiting one of these sections near Breezewood. Using bikes and helmets we'll tour two abandoned tunnels, the former site of the Breezewood rest stop, and the stretch of Turnpike in between. Later, we'll see the remnants of the Southern Pennsylvania Railroad, the camp used by the turnpike workers, which was previously a CCC camp, and later became a POW camp.

Scouts will need a helmet when riding and a bicycle light or headlamp in the tunnels.
